A truly unique event on the American Junior Golf Association's schedule, the biannual PING Junior Solheim Cup was inaugurated in 2002.

The event follows a similar format to The Solheim Cup and features the top 12 U.S. amateur girls versus their European counterparts.

The event is held over two days with six fourball and six foursomes matches followed by 12 singles matches the second day.

The United States won the inaugural event in 2002 but things are all square heading into the 2009 installment hosted by Aurora Country Club.

Paula Creamer, eight-time LPGA Tour winner, was named 2003 Rolex Junior Player of the Year and won 11 AJGA events including the prestigious 2003 Polo Golf Junior Classic. Creamer represented the U.S. in the 2002 and 2003 PING Junior Solheim Cups.

Morgan Pressel, the youngest player in LPGA Tour history to win a major championship, was a five-time Rolex Junior All-American and won 2005 Rolex Junior Player of the Year honors. She competed in two PING Junior Solheim Cups (2002, 2005).
